FACT SHEET

- Named for the five Sullivan brothers of Waterloo, who died together during WWII when their ship, the USS Juneau, was sunk in the South Pacific in November 1942.
- Facility is a 32,000 square-foot, \$11.5 million expansion of the Grout Museum District in downtown Waterloo.
- Honors the service and sacrifice of all Iowa veterans, from the Civil War to the present, in both war and peace.
- Houses permanent and temporary exhibits, oral histories, documentary materials and artifacts, including planes, tanks, and a near life-size re-creation of the bow of the USS Juneau.
- Interactive video exhibit portrays the stories of veterans from all corners of the state, interviewed especially for this project.
- Offers a veteran registration program that, as it grows, will be vital information for researchers and genealogists.
